The 36. Infanterie-Division (1. Welle) was formed during the expansion of the Army after the introduction of universal military service in March 1935. In May 1940 it took part in the western campaign and was converted to the 36. Infanterie-Division (mot.) on November 1, 1940. In June 1941 it fought in the eastern campaign, northern sector, crossing the Baltic States and advancing northward via Pskov, Lyady, and Luga to Gatchina. The division was transferred to the Nevel-Velizh area in September for offensive operations at Rzhev, Kalinin, and Pushkino. In 1942 and to the spring of 1943 it defended the Dukhovshchina, Yartsevo, and Demidov areas. On March 21, 1943, the division was again reorganized as the 36. Infanterie-Division, moving to Orel in July 1943, where it fought in the Kursk offensive. The division withdrew to

the Vitebsk area in September 1943, later transferring to the Rechitsa-Rogachev area for offensive actions, and withdrew to the Berezina River in the latter part of 1943. Although no records of this division dated later than December 31, 1943, are available, situation maps of Lage Ost show that it participated in position defense in the area south of Bobruisk from January to June 1944, when it withdrew from the eastern front. In the summer of 1944 the division was reorganized as the 36. Grenadier-Division and moved to the Saarbrücken area in September and later to the Trier area. In October 1944 it was redesignated the 36. Volksgrenadier-Division and in December 1944 and January 1945 it fought in the Bitche area.
