Armeeoberkommando Ligurien (Army of Liguria)

The Army of Liguria originated probably in 1944 as Armeegruppe Ligurien. In February 1945 it was elevated to army status. It was established as an Italian Fascist army responsible for internal order in northwestern Italy and for the defense of the Franco-Italian frontier. The Army was composed mainly of Italian units but also German. Among the former were the "Italia, "Littoria," "San Marco," and "Monte Rosa" Divisions. The Army's commander was Marshal Rodolfo Graziani.
