The forerunner of the division was formed in the winter of 1939-40 as the 1. Kavallerie-Division from the 1. Kavallerie-Brigade, which had taken part in the campaign in Poland. The 1. Kavallerie-Division participated in the western campaign in May 1940 and was transferred to the eastern front in June 1941. It was reorganized as the 24. Panzer-Division at Ohrdruf in November 1941, and was moved in March 1942 to the Guer area in France for training. In May 1942 the division was transferred to the southern sector of the eastern front, where in January 1943 the greater part of the division was destroyed at Stalingrad. Remnants of the division were assembled at Stalino and Rostov in February 1943 and transferred to Lisieux, France, where the division was reorganized. In August 1943 it was transferred to central Italy, where it secured this area after the capitulation of Italy. The division returned in October 1943 to the southern sector

of the eastern front where it participated in defense against Russian attacks in the Nikopol, Krivoi Rog, Krasnograd, Dne-prodzerzhinsk, and Znamenka areas. Although no records of this division dated later than December 31, 1943, are available, situation maps of Lage Ost show that in January and February 1944 it defended the area south of Krivoi Rog and in March and April it withdrew to Jassy via Voznesensk and Balta. From April to August it took part in position defense in the Jassy area, and from August 1944 to January 1945 in defensive actions in the Busko and Dukla areas of Poland, the Nagykörös and Eger areas of Hungary, and the Krupino area of Slovakia. In January 1945 the division moved to Rastenburg, East Prussia, and defended the Heiligenbeil and Braunsberg (Eraniewo) areas from February to April 1945.
