

Armeeoberkommando 25 (Twenty-fifth Army)

The Twenty-fifth Army was formed on November 10, 1944, from the former Armee-Abteilung Narva. It was placed in the Netherlands to control German units there after the transfer of the Fifteenth Army to the Aachen area. The army was under the command of Lieutenant General Friedrich Christiansen until January 28, 1945, Lieutenant General Günther Blumentritt from February 3 to March 20, 1945, and Lieutenant General Phillip Kleffel until April 7, 1945. On this date the Twenty-fifth Army was redesignated Fortress Holland (Festung Holland).
