

Fallschirm-Armeeoberkommando (Parachute Army)

The Parachute Army was formed on May 1, 1944 under the command of General Kurt Student. It was stationed first in Perugia, Italy, then in Berlin, and later in Nancy, France, where it trained and controlled parachute units. In the autumn of 1944 it became operational and took part in operations in Belgium and Holland. It was in Eastern Holland and the Cleve area at the beginning of 1945, and was disbanded on May 5, 1945. Other commanders of the Army were Generals Alfred Schlemm, Günther Blumentritt and Erich Straube.
