This unit was formed in 1939 as Grenzschutzabschnittskommando 3 (Border Security Command 3) and was designated the Höheres Kommando z.b.V. XXXIII from October 18 to November 15, 1939. The Corps was renamded Höheres Kommando XXXIII on November 16, 1939. It participated in the Polish campaign in southern Poland. In October 1939 the Corps was transferred to Dortmund via Opole and Dülmen and on March 3, 1940, to the Freiburg area to secure the Swiss-German border. It took part in the western campaign in the Belfort-Mulhouse area from June 15, 1940. The Corps was transferred to the Trondheim area of Norway via Aalborg, Denmark, and Oslo in July-August 1940. It participated in occupation duties, coastal and air defense, and training in the Alesund, Kristiansund, Trondheim, Bodo, and Narvik areas. On January 25, 1943, the Corps was redesignated Generalkommando XXXIII. A.K.
